The Pastor's Perspective



Dear Ones in Christ,

With the recent announcement about the UMC possible split, we find ourselves in uncertain times.

This seems to be causing more fear and apprehension than ever. We have more questions than answers and that doesn't help with the anxiousness of the situation. Above all, it is important to remember:

1. Nothing has been decided, even if the media and those who are sharing the proposal make it seem as if this is a done deal.

2. Each individual congregation has a responsibility to continue ministering in the midst of the struggle to those in need in our community.

#1: We are United Methodists, and our lives together are decided by the General Conference (the body of laity and clergy persons from around the world comprises about 1,000 delegates) which comes together every four years. The General Conference (GC) is the only body that speaks for the UMC as a whole. Whatever agreements or proposals that have been discussed are all preliminary until GC. The most recent proposal is one of many that will come before the delegates for their discernment.

General Conference is May 5 - 15, 2020. Right on the heels of that will be our own MI Area Annual Conference, May 28 - 31, 2020.

While we live in these uncertain times, might I be so bold to say—this is not the time for you to leave your church, no matter where you find yourself in the midst of the struggle. And no matter our differences, it is critical that as the body of Christ in this place, members and friends are able to lovingly talk to each other. But probably more importantly, we need to take the time to listen to each other and not make assumptions or be critical of each other.

#2: John 13:34-35 (Jesus said) "I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."

Cherry Angel Cream Cake (This makes a nice "Valentine-like" dessert)

| One 10-12 oz. angel food cake (purchased or home made, as you prefer) | |
| One 14 oz, Eagle Brand sweetened condensed milk | 1 cup cold water |
| 1 teaspoon almond extract | 1 small instant vanilla pudding |
| 8 oz. Cool Whip | 2 cans cherry pie filling |

Cut cake into 1/4" slices. Arrange 1/2 of the cake in the bottom of a 9x13" pan. In a large bowl combine Eagle Brand milk, water and extract. Mix well. Add pudding and mix well. Chill for 5 minutes. Fold in Cool Whip. Spread 1/2 of the cream mixture over cake slices. Top with 1 can of the cherry filling. Arrange rest of the cake slices. Mix remaining cream mixture with the 2nd can of the pie filling and spread on top. Chill 4 hours until set.

**In his first Joyful Journey blog of 2020, Bishop David Bard writes about important tasks before
The Michigan Conference of The UMC ... ministry work, soul work, and grief work.**

Perhaps some of you are familiar with the beautiful words of Howard Thurman's,
"The Work of Christmas."

*When the song of the angels is stilled,
When the star in the sky is gone,
When the kings and princes are home,
When the shepherds are back with their flock,
The work of Christmas begins:
To find the lost,
To heal the broken,
To feed the hungry,
To release the prisoner,
To rebuild the nations,
To bring peace among people,
To make music in the heart.*

I have been pondering those words in recent days as we begin a new year, a new decade. I have been thinking about them as tensions with Iran have escalated following the killing of an Iranian general, which followed the deaths of Americans in Iraq. Our president has said that he does not wish to start a war, and I think we will need to hold him and other elected officials to that as part of the work of rebuilding nations, the work of the Prince of Peace whose birth we have just celebrated.

I have been thinking about these words as we head into another presidential election year. The divisions in our country are significant, often accompanied by anger and the use of words as weapons. How might we, followers of Jesus Christ, be leaven, calming tempers and promoting genuine conversation? How might we remind ourselves and others of the common good, of the importance of the general welfare which has to do with healing the broken, feeding the hungry, setting free?

I have been thinking about Thurman's words particularly in light of the release of the "Protocols of Reconciliation and Grace Through Separation", a proposal for the future of The United Methodist Church. I have said that I think this is a hopeful development even as I am saddened by the idea of separation. I need to be clear, that this is only a proposal and there is a long road ahead in the coming months for this proposal to become legislation which might then become an official United Methodist Church agreement approved by the delegates of General Conference. I am committed to meeting with our Michigan delegation to discuss this proposal and look forward to hearing their ideas and feedback. I am looking forward to wider conversations within our conference about this proposal.

DONATION LEADS TO SURPRISE CHRISTMAS GIFT

What do you get for your parents for Christmas when they have all they want or need - that was the dilemma of the Jones children and grandchildren this past year. Then they saw the article in the paper where Central United Methodist Church, through their Endowment Fund, had contributed \$15,000 towards the construction of the new Teen Foster Home. That gave them an idea - so they contacted a member of the Chippewa County Family Project (CCFP) to see what options were available.

Their choice was to donate a farmhouse-style dining room table in honor of Ben and Sharon, large enough to seat eight to ten residents and to be constructed by the Sault Schools Career Center (see picture below). It was chosen because they all knew how important family dinners were to the Ben Jones family, and hoped the teens would be blessed with similar family dinners at their new home. They also donated dinnerware and glassware to serve all the residents.



The CCFP's 5,000 square foot teen foster home is under construction on 3 Mile Road and is slated to open in June 2020. It will assist some of the estimated 100 homeless teens in the area by providing long-term accommodations for up to 12 teens (6 girls and 6 boys) and emergency shelter for siblings.

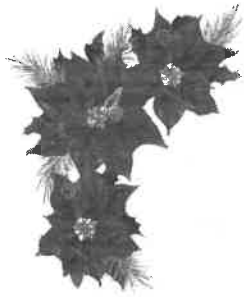

CENTRAL'S 2019 FINAL FINANCE REPORT

The Finance Committee is charged with the financial planning and stewardship planning of contributions and expenses of Central United Methodist Church, and they have held five meetings during the 2019 calendar year. The Committee continues to report the financial position of the Church's finances through reports provided to the Administrative Council. All church committee chairs continue to monitor their budgets closely, and prudently make expenditures as necessary to support the missions of our congregation.

Balance sheet fund balances as of December 31, 2019 are:

General Fund	\$44,751.04
Memorial Fund	\$24,842.45
Building Fund	\$56,079.03
Designated Fund	\$23,285.05

The General Fund balance is greater than we normally carry, primarily due to a \$45,000 transfer from the Endowment Fund to pay for previously approved projects. The funds will be expended as the projects get underway in the first six months of 2020.

Noteworthy items associated with the 2019 financials are:

- (1) District and Conference Apportionments/Askings were paid in full for the second year in a row.
- (2) Pledged contributions exceeded our budget by 14%.
- (3) Special offerings (Easter/Christmas) exceeded the budget by 62%.
- (4) Expenses for the year came in 13% less than budgeted.
- (5) At year end, all local bills were paid to date.

The 2019 Stewardship Campaign was held in October, and the theme this year was "**Generous Saints Share Their Time, Treasure and Talents.**" To date, 2020 pledges to the General Fund and the Building Fund are running slightly ahead of the 2019 campaign, and the pledges to apportionments are slightly behind the 2019 campaign. If you haven't made your commitment for 2020, there is still time.

The 2020 budget is in process, and we are looking to submit it for Administrative Council approval at the next scheduled meeting.

On behalf of the Finance Committee, we wish to thank the membership for their support and commitment to the life and mission of our church and the projects and people we support.
